





TENTERDEN THE JEWEL OF THE WEALD

Widely regarded as one of the most charming towns in the South East, Tenterden and its surrounding villages and countryside is a fascinating place to visit and explore.

It is home to two museums (the town museum and the Col. Stephens Museum - his life and light railways), numerous historic buildings and churches and great local attractions such as the Kent & East Sussex Railway and some first class places to stay and eat.

Nearby there are wonderful gardens and historic houses including Smallhythe Place, Hole Park Gardens, Great Dixter House and Gardens, Sissinghurst Castle Gardens and Leeds Castle. The historic towns of Rye and Cranbrook, the sandy beaches of Camber and the mysterious and atmospheric Romney Marsh are close by.

Tenterden and District Museum



In a quiet location just off Tenterden High Street, the 19th century weatherboard building was a coach house and stables. Exhibits show the history of Tenterden and the Cinque Ports.


2 St. Mildred's Church


